
# Elvis Gospel Fan Club Zuarterly Newsletter 2020-3




I pray that you feel his love more today than you ever have before! God bless you all!!! We love you all!

# How Elvis Rose to the Challenge ~ Elvis in Concert on November 14, 1972 at the Long Beach Arena in Long Beach, California.


This is the show that Aloha from Hawaii producer Marty Pasetta attended along with his wife. When he met with Elvis in Las Vegas a few days later to discuss the satellite show, Pasetta didn't hold back, but instead told him that he thought his singing was wonderful, but his stage presence was boring and that he needed to lose weight. As you can imagine, Elvis was not used to anyone talking to him so directly, prompting him to jump out of his chair, go over to Marty, hug him and tell him that he was the first person who had been honest with him a long while.

Of course we now know that Elvis accepted the challenge given to him as he showed up state in Honolulu in January of 1973 looking spectacular and singing with a level focus, professionalism and conviction not seen since the '68 TV Special.

### The Thrill of Your Love

I can't help but wonder what Elvis' thoughts were when presented with this song, recording it in early 1960 shortly after his return from the Army. He often denied his songs were auto biographical but this one has always given me a different feel. Elvis Presley was far from unloved or alone, in fact, just the opposite, worldwide. He had every reason financially and fame wise to be sitting on top of the world. But did this song hit him deep within or do we just read too much into things?

His early 60's voice is tinged with a bit of soulful yearning that is difficult to fabricate, an edge to his new maturity with a quality of a youthful ache. It's as if the words come from a deeper place of an experience he wished he'd never had.

Elvis was young, barely 25 and life at his feet. I love the emotion of this song, real or fabricated but equally convincing either way. Truth is truth - the things that count in this world have far more worth than the temporal things that can slip on by. It was true then and it's true now, more than ever.

Reading this, I began to think how I respond to the song. Of course almost any song about love, with the change of a few words, can be thought of as a gospel song, rejoicing in God's love for us. This song talks about the thrill of love and it is indeed thrilling to know that the maker of the universe, not only created us, but also loves us unconditionally and no earthly price, no sacrifice is too much to give. Of course we can't buy God's love, it is free, but in order to live fully in that love we do need to make some sacrifices.

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# Elvis Gospel Service in The Netherlands at Veenkerk July 5, 2020 led by Rev. Fred Omvlee

Our friend, Rev. Fred Omvlee has done much research about Elvis and organises many Elvis Gopel services in the Netherlands. The services are conducted in the Dutch language, but Fred has kindly tranlated the service for us. Below is an edited (for length) version:

Theme: About the beam and the splinter, Elvis and Jesus.

Piano intro:... improvisation on Crying in the Chapel

### Fred: I would like to start with a prayer:

Good God, We are here in thoughts together, From our houses, in this house of yours. We take everything that is important in our life, everything that is beautiful and everything that is difficult. We lay that down for you and we ask you: be with us: In the difficult moments and in the beautiful moments.

Be with us with your Spirit, we ask you that for now and for all days of our lives. In Jesus' name, Amen.

#### Fred:

In my daily life I am a chaplain in the navy for the last 18 years. Before that I was a pastor in the beautiful town of Monnickendam, where I still live. Working in the navy has also changed my faith and church work. Less than in church you can fall back on what people are used to. Young people in the navy are usually not churchgoers. But they are interested in the services on board. I have been operational for 16 years, with services in Afghanistan and at sea off the coast of Africa, off Libya, on the Caribbean sea and on Curaçao. There I learned to use what touches myself and what the visitors bring themselves. Pop music by the crew members and Elvis gospels by myself. I have been an Elvis fan since I was 11, when Elvis died in 1977. Elvis was swinging, attractive to me. Much later did I learn the power of his gospels. They are emotional, perhaps sentimental. But they touch me. Balm for my soul.

**Fred sings Peace in the Valley**, about the desire for rest: now I am tired and lonely, but I have to keep going, but there will be peace in the valley for me someday. It is the vision of Isaiah: One day the animals will live peacefully side by side and I will be another human.

**Bible Reading**: Luke 6: 36-43 (New Bible Translation)

**Meditation**: About the beam, the splinter, Elvis and Jesus ...

Dear people,

The beautiful words of Jesus fit very well with this time: in which we have fierce debates and people scold each other on social media and in demonstrations. Be merciful, as your Father is merciful. Don't judge, and you won't be judged. Why do you look at that splinter in your brother's or sister's eye when you don't notice the beam in your own eye?

It seems like we like to judge hard these days. But anyone who is honest will have to recognize that it is not perfect in his or her own life. Let's give each other some space. Also to be different.

The young rock star Elvis was immediately reviled by parents, by teachers, and by church. That couldn't be good, dancing so wildly and shaking your hips. Incredible to us now perhaps, but his legs were no longer allowed on TV, because they were regarded obscene.

This young star who became an inspiration for Bob Dylan, John Lennon, Jim Morrison, Bono and Bruce Springsteen, sought refuge in gospels. That put his mind at ease. He sang the gospels from the beginning of his career until his last performance.

Was Elvis a saint? Definitely not. He was just a recognizable person with many talents, beauty and voice and a number of shortcomings: he was insecure, depressed, sought support with the wrong friends and stimulants. It led to his early death at age 42.

But from the faith in which our father and mother Omvlee brought us up: you can always start over. A simple, cheerful faith. Do your best. Ask God for help. Forgive, then you will be forgiven. Big words, not easy, but beautiful. Jesus says it even better here: be generous: because the measure that you use for others will also be used for you.

We can be inspired by the talents of others: their music, their singing, their beauty. That can raise you ip, don't be discouraged by the beauty of others.

I think one of Elvis's life lessons is his energy: do what you do with genuine energy. Then that energy comes over and we recharge each other. Be a king or a queen on your square meter. And let's be gentle with each other's shortcomings: the beams and splinters. Be kind to yourself is an advice that I also give to my fellow spiritual counselors in defense. Because often people give a lot of care to another, but they forget to take care of themselves.

A service like this: whether online, at sea, or on a mission in a war zone is a moment to realize what you're thankful for. Look around, look at what you have and count your blessings. I believe a flower can bloom through any raindrops, I believe a candle burns in the darkest night, I believe that even in the heaviest storm, the smallest prayer is still heard.

Prayer: Good God,




Be with all of us worldwide who still suffer from this.

# Elvis' Grandson's Tragic Death

Benjamin Storm Keough died Sunday, July 12, at the age of 27.

Elvis' only grandson died on Sunday July 12<sup>th</sup> at his mother's Calabasas near Los Angeles home, from a self-inflicted gunshot wound. He was with his current girlfriend Diana Pinto, who tried to stop him and who called the police. Ben was a musician who had done some acting and had attended his grandfather's 80<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations at Graceland in Memphis in 2015

Please pray for Lisa at this time, especially for the divorce proceedings, for custody of her twin daughters to Michael Lockwood. The trial, which is expected to last through the end of August, will finally end the couple's 10-year marriage and decide who gets custody of their twin 11-year-old daughters Harper and Finley.

Michael Lockwood, 59, argued last week in court papers that he should be awarded primary custody of his daughters because he feared Lisa Marie could relapse back into drugs and booze due to her grief over Benjamin's suicide last month. Lisa Marie has admitted in the past to battling opioid and other painkiller addictions but claims to have been sober for the past three years. Michael Lockwood also expressed concerns in court documents about guns at the Presley's \$1.8 million home in Calabasas.

## Messages from Priscilla

These are some of the darkest days of my family's life. The shock of losing Ben has been devastating. Trying to put all the pieces together of all the possible whys has penetrated my soul. Each day I wake up I pray it will get better. Then, I think of my daughter and the pain she is going through as she was a doting mother. Ben's father, Danny, who is completely lost, as Ben was his only son. Riley, so loving and so close to him; Harper and Finley, who absolutely adored Ben.
